The Kansas Supreme Court's Role In Impartial Justice



What exactly does a state Supreme Court Justice do? Sometimes called the state's "court of last resort," the seven-member Kansas Supreme Court hears cases on petition for review from the Kansas Court of Appeals, original actions, and designated cases that can be appealed directly to it from district courts.

Justice Caleb Steagall, appointed by Gov. Sam Brownback in 2014, and Chief Justice Marla Luckert, appointed by Gov. Bill Graves in 2002, offer a perspective on how Kansas' judicial system works and its critical role in maintaining a lawful society in our state. Here's probably your only chance to ask the justices questions instead of the other way around!

*** HOST FAMILIES NEEDED ***

We have been contacted by a soccer coach asking if Rotary in the Wichita area could help to locate host families for three summer league soccer players. Head Soccer Coach (Eastern OK State) Gonzalo Carranza was previously employed by Friends University for several years. He will be the head coach for the Wichita summer league. He knows these students personally and vouches for their behavior. The details:

- The players are college students between the ages 18 – 24.
- The dates host families are needed are between May 7th and early July (probably round July 7). The ending date depends on the success of the team.
- Host families would be responsible for providing a safe place to stay. The family is asked to share family meals (if the family needs financial assistance, that can be provided). NO transportation would be required.

There are three players still needing a host family. A single host family for each player is preferred; however, it is possible to have two or even three host families for a player with each host taking few weeks. We know that perhaps plans have been made for summer vacations, trips, or other commitments during this time period. Besides the player attending practices and games (with some out-of-town trips), the players may be looking for part-time employment as well. Additionally, if any Rotarians have a family member who plays soccer, this would be a great way to get some (free) coaching and guidance.
