THANK YOU ROTARIANS: SHAWN WISENHANT, LINDSAY BENENCKA, ALAN KENNEDY, AND HONORARY ROTARIAN VICKI WISENHANT!!!!!!

This house is for a single mother that immigrated from the Congo to the USA about 5 years ago. Despite working hard and supporting her family, she has not been able to get a home of her own. A lack of formal education limits her ability to elevate herself in her work and get any advancement. Regardless of her hard work with minimum wage she has been paying over \$850.00 per month for a 2 bedroom apartment. This is a huge financial detriment and she cannot save nor support her children.

The Habitat House that she is buying is 1100sqft and is a 3 bedroom, one bath house with a one-car garage and a yard for her children. The property value of the house is estimated to be near \$85-\$90K after it is completed and with the program, the homeowner will only pay about \$450.00 per month! This will save her \$400 per month. For someone on minimum wage, this is a LIFE CHANGING opportunity and one she is so grateful for.
